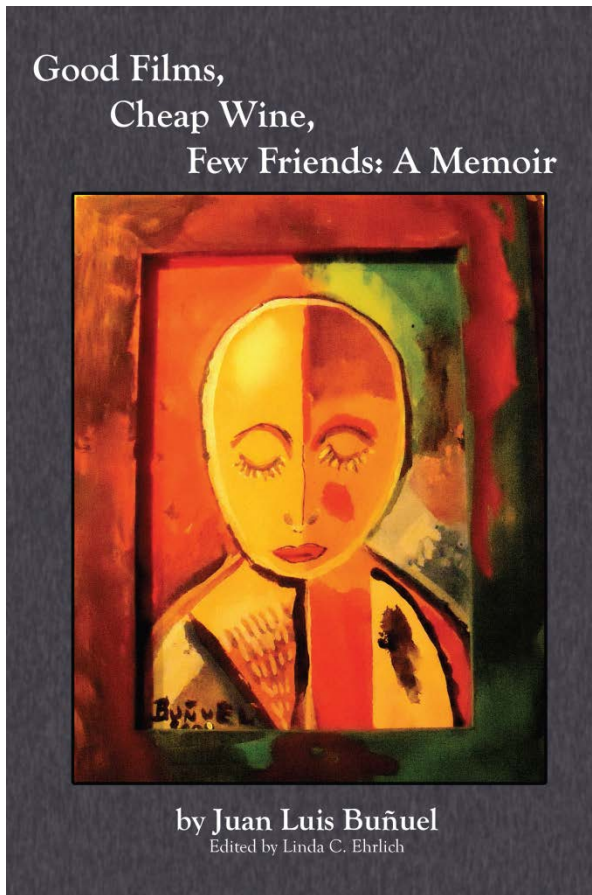


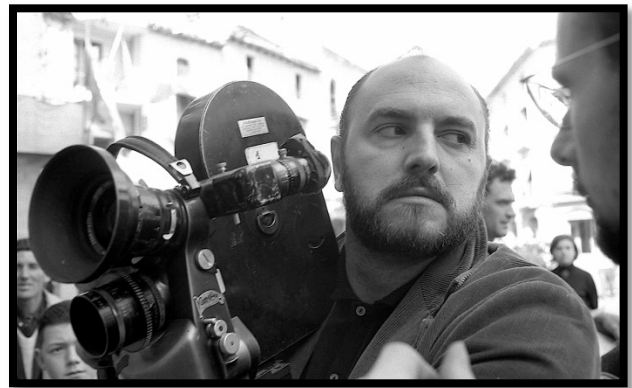
# Good Films, Cheap Wine, Few Friends: A Memoir
