Our research workshop investigates the performative aspects of Japanese traditions through several prisms. It focuses mainly on two general fields -- the performing arts and religious ritual practice -- in both their temporal and spatial dimensions, and touches upon further performative aspects of politics, gender, and the arts. The gathering of a diverse group of scholars from Japan, Europe, USA, Canada and Israel enables a unique exchange of viewpoints and analytical approaches. The workshop is intended to add an essential layer to the field of performance studies in Japan, and to lay the groundwork for a conceptual redefinition of the performative aspect of Japanese culture.
